Lakeshore Art Festival "Keepin' it GREEN"

The DTE Energy Foundation announced they will be expanding their support for "Greening," or recycling programs, to Muskegon's Lakeshore Art Festival in downtown Muskegon. DTE Energy Foundation will be partnering with Schupan & Sons, one of Michigan's largest recycling firms, in an effort to provide the festival with all recyclable organic material.

"Our goal is to reduce the carbon footprint of these festivals by recycling plastic, aluminum cans, glass and other materials," said Faye Nelson, DTE Energy vice president, Public Affairs, and Foundation president. "This effort is one of the many ways in which we partner with a number of environmental organizations and government agencies to preserve, protect and sustain our state's natural resources."

Lakeshore Art Festival is providing compostable and recyclable bins to its food vendors, as well as multiple plastic/cardboard recycling locations for its exhibitors and guests to utilize. DTE will provide food vendors with biodegradable cups and Arts & Carafes will utilize biodegradable plates for their interactive children's art event. The Lakeshore Art Festival has requested that all vendors/exhibitors avoid using Styrofoam.

"Our intention is to significantly reduce the amount of waste that is generated from our event and we feel the current measures we are taking are a step in the right direction," commented Carla Flanders, Lakeshore Art Festival Director.

"It is a pleasure to partner with an environmentally responsible organization such as the DTE Energy Foundation," said Marc Schupan, CEO of Schupan & Sons. "We applaud their increased recycling efforts and are excited to expand our part in those efforts. With the need to preserve our natural resources and decrease our carbon footprint, this is a win-win all around."
